FRAMING

To incorporate your screen into your space aesthetically and safely, here are several methods to achieve a beautiful and secure setup.

Interior Installation:

Framing:

- Construct a simple wooden frame using materials like cedar or your preferred wood.
- Attach the screen to the frame using appropriate screws or fasteners.
- Mount the framed screen onto the wall, ensuring it is level and securely fastened.

Screwing Directly:

- For a minimalist look, you can screw the screen directly into the wall.
- Make sure to screw into wall study or use wall anchors for a secure hold.

Hanging:

- If you prefer a flexible option, you can hang the screen using hooks or brackets.
- Install sturdy hooks or brackets on the wall at the desired height.
- Note: Hanging is only appropriate for indoor installations.

Exterior DIY Installation:

Through extensive testing, we have identified several effective methods for installing these elegant screens outdoors. One particularly reliable approach is the "sandwich frame" technique. Regardless of the method you choose, ensure the screen is firmly secured to prevent any movement or damage.

Simple Cedar Sandwich:

- Use two pieces of cedar (or your preferred wood) measuring between 1"x2" and 1"x4".
- Secure these pieces with ceramic-coated fence/decking screws through all three layers (the frame and panel) to ensure the screen remains firmly in place.
- Each screen includes space for framing, so consider the thickness of the frame when selecting your wood pieces. A stable frame ensures that your screen remains secure and intact.

Important Note:

In high wind areas: "If it can shake, it can break!" The classic dado (groove) system works great for 'no wind' areas, but not for 'high wind' areas.

Other options include:

- **Aluminium Frame Kit**: This can be freestanding or incorporated into a pre-existing structure.
- Custom Frame: Work with a metal fabricator or carpenter for a custom frame.

By following these guidelines, you can ensure a secure and beautiful installation of your screens, whether indoors or outdoors.
